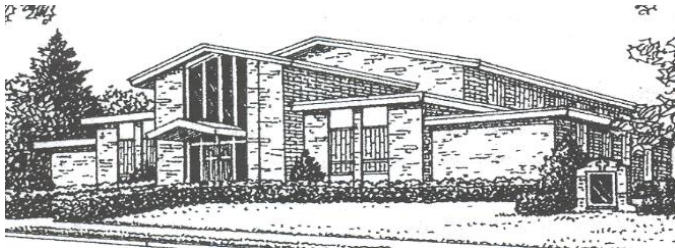

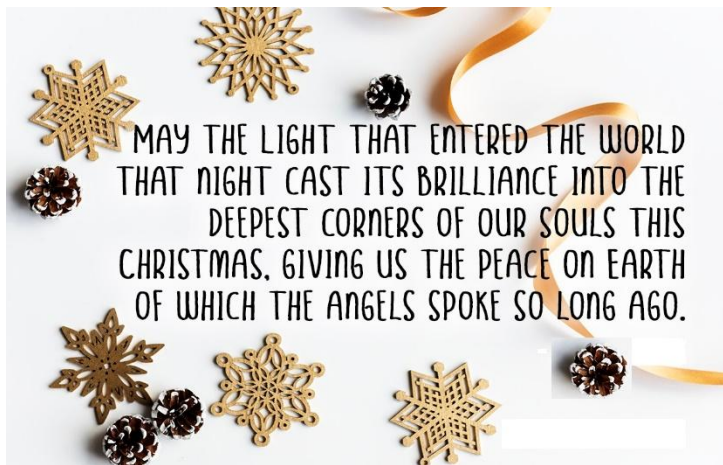

It is hard to believe that yet another church year is ending and a new one beginning. I have to be honest, we are over halfway through November and my Halloween decorations are still outside. Between the first semester of my doctoral program coming to an end and the busyness of life, I just haven't had the chance to take them down. The truth is that sometimes I am just not ready and right now I am not ready for anything. I am not ready for the lengthening nights. I am not ready for the cold winter air. I am not ready for the end of one church year and the beginning of something new. What I desire more than anything else, at least at this moment, is to just pause time for a while so I can breathe.

I wish Advent could really be used for us to slow ourselves down and sit with the hope of the season. Unfortunately, that isn't how our world works. The Christmas season means the busyness of shopping, baking, planning, and celebrating. For me, it means that it is almost time to bake several hundred kiffles, plan multiple worship services, buy and wrap gifts, and start praying that it doesn't snow before my worship services on Christmas Eve so I can travel safely from church to church. I know all of you are just as busy as I am. So, here is my little prayer for you even if you are struggling to find time to slow down or if you are finding that you, too, are just not ready. May the hope, peace, joy, and love of the season find you and may the Light of the World shine in your lives today and every day.

Disasterbating by Matt Laney

Jesus said: "Can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?" -Matthew 6:27 (NRSV)

In my experience, worry is future oriented. Because the future is always out of reach, we are free to concoct as many catastrophes as we can imagine. How often does reality measure up to our doomsday scenarios? Almost never.

Worrying is addictive. Worry is a form of fear that releases juicy doses of adrenaline into the bloodstream. Those who enjoy extreme sports, horror films, and risky activities might be doping on adrenaline. Disasterbating is a rush.

Compared to other drugs, adrenaline might appear harmless, but I'm not so sure. The lessons of January 6, 2021, or the hysteria over fabricated threats such as "critical race theory" testify to the dangerous power of repeated doping on anger and fear.

Jesus said, "Don't worry." I have a feeling he said it a lot. Because learning to love, allowing love to rise above our worries and fears, is the purpose of this life. That's our only job: No matter what life throws at us, no matter how crappy things get, no matter if the country falls apart, we keep showing up with love. That's it.

Jesus revealed what a life of love looks like in an anxious, fear-filled world, which is why any form of Christianity based on worry, fear, and disasterbating is anti-Christ.

Worried? Me? I'm afraid so, Jesus. Just for today, help me put it aside so that love can flow.

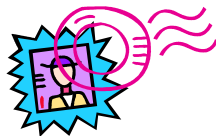

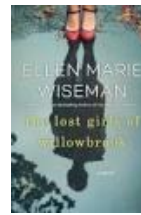

**Letter from Our Conference Minister Dated
November 14, 2024**

“For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.” (Matthew 6:21, NRSV)

Dear Friends,

If you missed our historic meeting on November 9, here are the four conference results from the vote on the merger motion:

- a) PWC: 135 YES; 15 NO = 90%
- b) PCC: 286 YES; 28 NO = 91%
- c) PNEC: 141 YES; 2 NO = 98.6%
- d) PSEC: 246 YES; 19 NO = 92%

The widespread support for our moving forward makes me incredibly happy. This means you all believe we have done the research and the work to determine this as a positive option for our conferences. Thank you!

The motion also generated questions about what this will mean for us as a conference, as we move into becoming an association. One of the questions was funding. Our Churches Wider Mission (OCWM) is funding from congregations that will go directly to the conference. That will continue as we become the Keystone Conference. This raises the question about how to fund the work of our association. One of the options is to continue to expand individual and congregational support of Friends of the PNEC, which we will rename as we become an association. This money could fund our administrative costs, mailings, etc. and supplement the scholarship resources that will support pastors, continuing education, youth programming and authorization preparation.

We will need an association board that will involve some expenses which will be supported both by the conference and by the association, which can include fees for programs and events, as well as the Friends of the PNEC resources.

If you are unfamiliar with the Friends of the PNEC, this is a fund established for individuals and churches to support the conference in addition to the OCWM funds we retain. It is important for you to know that 10% of all OCWM dollars received by the conference go to support the national setting of the UCC. Friends of the PNEC is anticipated to augment OCWM gifts in an unrestricted way, so that new and continuing programs can be supported.

November 24, 2024, has been established by the Conference Board as Covenant Sunday, when congregations are asked to celebrate the covenantal relationships within and among the settings of the UCC (congregation, conference, and national setting). Worship resources have been provided and we ask individuals and congregations to have a special offering to support Friends of the PNEC. Please consider giving generously as you celebrate our conference and the programs that we continue to offer. May our generosity be in gratitude for the partnership we have and the programs and resources we share.
