Welcome Home by Yael Lachman

How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity! – Psalm 133:1 (NRSV)

Imagine, if you will, that your neighbors are having a big family party. Every time their front door opens, you hear a chorus of joyful greetings: Hello! You're here! So great to see you!

Now imagine that you're walking through an oak woodland, and you hear the same kind of ecstatic greeting. Only here, the shouts of joy are coming from high above your head, and they sound something like, Waka-waka-waka!! If you look up quickly, you'll witness the event that has occasioned this loud celebration: an acorn woodpecker has just returned from a foraging expedition, causing family and friends to flap their wings and shout for joy.

I've spent many happy hours beneath the oaks, observing the clownish antics of *Melanerpes formicivorus*, and I am here to tell you that this wild greeting takes place all day long, every single time a bird returns to the communal tree. Apparently, the joy of welcoming someone home never gets old.

And what a home it is! Acorn woodpeckers live in social groups of a dozen or more birds, storing acorns in their shared granaries: dead trees pocked with thousands of acorn-shaped holes, many of which were drilled by past generations of birds. Communal groups also have an unusual mating arrangement in which multiple males and females breed together, raise chicks in one big cohort, and share resources cooperatively.

Even non-breeding siblings sometimes stick around for years, helping to forage for food, manage the shared acorn stash, and care for younger birds.

How good it is, indeed, for kindred to live together. Hallelujah! Waka-waka! Welcome home!



...God is still speaking.

Letter from Our Conference Minister Dated

May 15, 2025

"For it is you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you for I am fearfully and wonderfully made." (Psalm 139:13-14)

Dear Friends,

It's a rainy Thursday as I sit to write this letter. Usually, a scripture comes quickly to mind when I prepare to write but I must admit the idea for the letter came first. I searched for the scripture later. If you've been following me around lately you know that my back has been giving me problems, and I needed to be "pushed around" in a wheelchair at the Spring Meeting and am still using a walker. I am steadily improving, and I think I'll be without extra appliances for assistance soon.

That being said, I have discovered a few of the challenges that folks with mobility issues experience. During the last few weeks, I have noticed some barriers to accessibility that we, as a church, might want to address. So, I'm going to ask a number of questions, and I invite you to look around your church buildings and see what issues there may be.

How far is the handicap parking space from the entrance ramp? How level is the sidewalk or pathway? Will someone get stuck and need to lift their walker to get over bumps and cracks? Do you have a ramp that ends at a door, which then requires a step into the building? How level is the door frame at the entrance with the ramp or sidewalk? How far away is that entrance from the sanctuary and social spaces? Is the door so heavy that it requires one person to open it so another person can walk through? Could a person open the door with one hand while walking with a walker into the building?

Once inside, is there a chair lift or an elevator to enable a person to navigate stairs? Are there clear directions on how to operate the lift or is someone monitoring its use to assist? How about access to the chancel and the pulpit? Could a person navigate access, are there stairs, are there railings for support?

What about your restrooms? Do you have handicap accommodations like higher toilets, support bars, doors that swing easily so a walker can be maneuvered through the entrance? How easy would it be to reach the soap dispenser, the faucets, the towels?

Can someone easily access the social spaces? Can they get coffee and snacks? Are the chairs easily moveable?

In recent years we have all sought to be more welcoming to our neighbors, more accessible to newcomers. Sometimes we have focused on the theology of hospitality and welcome. And we should. But the practical issues of hospitality are also important. If I cannot navigate myself into the space, if I cannot be comfortable moving around, if I constantly need to ask for assistance to get from room to room or place to place, I might be so embarrassed that I may not return.

I encourage all our congregations to look at the Accessible to All resources from the national setting. Look around your spaces. Clear barriers. Remove challenges to access. Trust me, it's important.
