FROM PASTOR BECKY ...

While the leaves hadn't really begun to change yet during my trip to Colorado, I did notice a few had turned and started to fall to the ground. My mother has pulled some pumpkins from her garden. The sun is definitely setting earlier. Halloween and Thanksgiving decorations are filling the shelves. This year, I'm trying to look at things a little differently. Instead of allowing the arrival of autumn to fill me with the dread and sadness of winter, I'm trying to pause in the beauty of the season. The truth is every year seems like it is going faster and if I keep wasting time dreading winter I'll miss out on the lessons of the season that I am in.

Autumn is a season that can remind us to pause and to let go. Like the trees, we sometimes need to rid ourselves of the things in our lives that are no longer serving a purpose, the things that sometimes weigh us down or distract us from God. Unlike the trees, who simply follow the changing of seasons, letting go of things can require trust from us. It certainly isn't easy and it forces us to open ourselves to the possibility of change. Our faith reminds us that God is at work in us, around us, and through us. As you begin to examine what you need to let go of in order to grow closer to God, I invite you to breathe and notice the reminders of God's presence all around you.

Burning Like A Fire by **John Edgerton**

May what you have stored up for the wicked fill their bellies; may their children gorge themselves on it, and may there be leftovers for their little ones. — Psalm 17:14 (NIV)

I'll say this for the psalms: they're honest.

Psalm 17 ends by wishing for vengeance, vengeance big enough and painful enough that there's suffering left over for the enemies' kids too. Being angry enough to wish suffering on children? It's not a good look on anyone, least of all the Bible!

But if I'm honest, I can get this angry too. I can get so angry that I waste a whole day arguing with someone in my head. I can get so angry that everything feels like one long parade of offenses against me personally.

So I'm glad that this psalm is written exactly as is. I'm glad because I know that I'm not alone in getting so frightfully angry.

When I'm so angry I feel my heart beating in my skull, I can do what I read in the 17th Psalm: I can pour my anger out in prayer to God, not trying to seem calm or reasonable, just being honest. And once I have poured out that poison before God, I can leave it behind.

Not all anger is poison. Anger can be holy fuel to right the world's wrongs. But I can't fool myself: not all my anger is holy. A lot of my anger is just poison, poison I need some way to leave behind.

If I want to leave my anger behind, God can take it. But only if I offer.

Prayer

When I'm so angry I feel like a fire about to ignite, may my prayers burn before you alone, that I might be healing balm to the world.





Letter from Our Conference Minister Dated September 18, 2025

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (Matthew 5:3-112, NRSV)

Dear Friends,

I turned to the Beatitudes today because I needed to affirm what I am called to do, to believe, and profess as a follower of Jesus. The world is increasingly violent, and hate filled, and I'm not sure how to be a peacemaker these days. Instead, today I want to focus on being merciful and pure in heart. How and to whom do I offer mercy? How do I stand for the righteousness that God, Jesus, and the Spirit call me to? How do I live my faith, follow Jesus, and be all I am called to be as a Christian.

I resisted commenting on the assassination of Charlie Kirk last week. Now I am reading in the news attacks and murders of police officers, three bomb threats in an Allentown school, more school shootings, more attacks of war in Ukraine, Gaza, and the US sinking of supposed drug boats from Venezuela. We are truly becoming a culture of violence and war. My heart is heavy every time I read or listen to any news — and yet, I feel I must be informed. Karl Barth, one of the most influential theologians of the 20th century put it this way: "Take your Bible, take your newspaper, and read both. But interpret newspapers from your Bible." [1] It's hard to interpret the news through scripture if you don't read or listen to it.

So even though my heart is heavy, I try to keep up with what's going on. I try to sort through the news and tie it to my scriptural understanding of our call to be merciful and righteous, to be pure in heart and be peacemakers. I don't have to tell you how difficult it is. Many of you already know.

Our General Minister and President wrote a response to the violence we are experiencing. [2] I commend the entire article to you, but quote from it here. "Violence is not to be condoned and is not an answer to resolving the differences that are a part of our social fabric. There are differences of opinion on any number of issues. Theological and political differences are not an invitation to hurt and harm others, or to end the lives of others.

The United Church of Christ strongly condemns these acts of violence and continues to call for a renewal of civil discourse in our communities. We mourn with

those who mourn, longing for a time when violence shall no more be heard in our land."[3]

I will strive to be righteous, pure, faithful, and merciful. I will speak truth in the face of violence. I will mourn with the grief-stricken. And I will call for peace – for no matter how vehemently we may disagree with one another, peaceful discourse, understanding, and grace are what we need to offer to one another, not bullets from guns and more violence. May it be so.

WE HAVE A NAME and A SPACE!!

We celebrate the decision of the Conference Board in our vote to name our Association the Mountain Valley Association of the Keystone Conference. And, we have a space for the Mountain Valley Association in St. Paul's United Church of Church, 105 East 19th Street, Northampton, PA.

About the Name...

Becky Sausser and Samantha Kistler made the name suggestion to the Board using the following:

"We believe this would be a great fit because it not only captures the geographic description of our area but also expresses a biblical message. In 1 Kings 18 when Elijah made his offering before God to speak truth to power, we see that mountain top moment. Following this prophetic action, he has a moment of severe doubt and anxiety, and heads to a cave, and we see his valley moment. Though we sometimes walk through the valley of the shadow of death, God is always with us, and God is still speaking!

We lift up Isaiah chapter 40:4 as the guiding text for this name.

"Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain."
