I am using it as a way to remind myself to approach each day with gratitude. May you take the time to pause and reconnect with God before all of the busyness of the holiday season takes over.

Who Scares You? by Mary Luti

But to the wicked God says, "Consider this, you who forget God, or I will tear you to pieces, with no one to rescue you." – Psalm 50:16a & 22 (NIV)

Lovely. God wants to rip our limbs off. The limbs of the wicked, that is, who probably deserve it. But it's still repulsive.

Whenever God's wrath scorches a page of scripture, I think, here's a Deity just begging to be despised. Before this God, you lower your head—not to adore, but to avoid detection.

How to fathom it?

Some people say the Bible's human authors misunderstood God's character. It's projection. Others point to all the instances of divine benevolence that outweigh the wrath. On balance, not so bad.

Some reject the "angry God of the Old Testament" and believe only in the "loving God of the New" (a false and historically harmful distinction, by the way; not to mention an official heresy called Marcionism).

God's wrath. There's no way to make it palatable. It isn't.

But sometimes I wonder why we demand of God what we don't demand of ourselves.

I mean, if you view God's destructive ferocity through the lens of the vast scope of our own, does God look more frightening than God's world looks today, abused and polluted? Is the scriptural fury of God more terrible than the actual fury of human greed, nationalism, war, xenophobia, and genocide?

If scripture says that sometimes God feels like tearing us to pieces, are we who violently loathe each other teaching God how it's done?

The God of Psalm 50 vows not to save us, yet does, time and time again. Are we reversible, too? Do we relent? Or are we always in more peril from each other than we've ever been from God?

Of whom should we really be afraid?

Prayer

Your wrath is repulsive and scary. Ours is even scarier. But if you must break something, break our hearts. Crack us open to love.






Letter from Our Conference Minister Dated October 15, 2025

"Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.'

(Matthew 25:34-36, NRSVUE)

Dear Friends.

I don't know about you, but I often get accused of being "too political" in my letters and in my interpretation of scripture. Many of us were raised with the "Jesus, meek and mild" model of our Savior. And he was loving and caring, healing and blessing of those around him – except when those individuals were damaging, controlling, killing, and restricting the faith of others; except when there was worship of power, wealth, empire, and violence as idols – instead of the worship of God and the hope and actions to bring about the kingdom God intended.

As I was reading a devotional from Richard Rohr this week, he offered this message, "Yes, Jesus of Nazareth was a political revolutionary...

To say that Jesus was a political revolutionary is to say that the message he proclaimed not only called for change in individual hearts but also demanded sweeping and comprehensive change in the political, social, and economic structures in his setting in life: colonized Israel. It means that if Jesus had his way, the Roman Empire and the ruling elites among his own people either would no longer have held their positions of power, or if they did, would have had to conduct themselves very, very differently.... It means that Jesus had a clear and unambiguous vision of the healthy world that God intended and that he addressed any issue—social, economic, or political—that violated that vision."^[1]

This is the message I try to share with people. Jesus was a revolutionary, but a revolutionary focused on care for the least among us, for those with no recourse, no access to supports, no freedom, no ability to make an impact on their lives based on the systems that were denying and controlling them. Jesus was the king who proclaimed that we are called to offer food to the hungry, water to the thirsty, clothing to the naked, comfort to the imprisoned and the ill. This is the message of Jesus, that love of neighbor involves not just prayer, but action to care for one another, to create a world where everyone has access to that which helps them live, that which gives the freedom of worship, that which allows them to thrive. That's a Jesus I follow. That's the revolution I seek – love for all our neighbors – in prayer and in action.

CONFERENCE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

Keystone Conference logo selected

Earlier this year, even before the vote in July by the 35th General Synod to recognize the merger of the four Pennsylvania Conferences to create the Keystone Conference, the Keystone Working Group decided that we needed a logo that everyone would easily recognize. They gave members of all the UCC churches in Pennsylvania the opportunity to submit a design for a logo. Entries had to be submitted by May 15. The four Conference Ministers narrowed down the 24 designs that were submitted to four that were presented to the Transitional Board of Directors at their first meeting on August 1. They chose a keystone design divided into fourths with different colors representing the four existing Conferences that were coming together to form the new Conference. The Cross and Orb of the United Church of Christ is overlaid on the design. Some changes were suggested for the font, and the final logo was approved by the Board at its September meeting.

The colorful keystone design was submitted by **George Mamas**. George is originally from Philadelphia, the son of Greek immigrant parents. He graduated from the Art Institute of Philadelphia (1993), and has since worked in various advertising and marketing agencies in the area. He is the proud father of Caroline, Phoenix, and Persephone, and devoted husband of Rev. Leslie Mamas (pastor, **Olivet-Schwenkfelder UCC**,

Norristown). In his free time, you might find him playing hockey, practicing his martial arts or at a comic convention. Besides the letterhead shown here, there will be several variations: horizontal or vertical, with or without "United Church of Christ." There will be guidance on how each version is to be used. Also look for Keystone "swag" as we get closer to January 1 and the official launch of the Keystone Conference.
